Comparisons-1970

Gail and I visited Israel in March 1970, in between two major wars there. Much has changed since then because of population increases and excavations. So I have scanned the original 35 mm Ektachrome slides at 600 dpi for comparison of some scenes. That visit was part of a 95-day round-the-world honeymoon that began a week after we were married. I had to study snowstorms in northern Japan for the first two months, but then we went home the long way.

As we traveled (in 2016) from Haifa to Capernaum, we first passed through the Jezreel Valley, a relatively flat area of rich agricultural land. In 1970 a trip up Mount Tabor gave us a good view of the Valley and Nazareth. In March the grain heads were green.
